## PUMPKIN POWER



It's pumpkin season! Did you know that pumpkins are packed full of Vitamin A? This vitamin is thought to protect against cancer and heart disease. Dig into this delicious pumpkin bread!

### Pumpkin Bread

- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/3 cup oil
- 2 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
- 1 tsp. cloves
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1/3 cup water
- 1 cup pumpkin

Mix together sugars, eggs and oil. Pour into greased and floured loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour.

*Optional ingredients:*  
3/4 c. chocolate chips,  
and/or 3/4 c. walnuts

## 2015 MM Subsidy Applications

The **Room Representatives** will get together for the first Family Involvement Association meeting at Children's House **from 4:30-5:15 on 10/29/14**.

Our first *group* FIA meeting will be held in November and will be hosted by the P4 Room Rep, Emily Hannigan. *All* parents are encouraged to attend FIA meetings.

To accommodate our non-MM families, we are going to try to alternate meeting locations between Children's House and MassMutual this year. As soon as we have a date for the November meeting, it will be posted.

If your Rep is unable to attend a FIA meeting, he/she may ask for someone else in the room to attend in their place. Please be supportive of them!

Children's House will soon begin collecting 2015 Subsidy Applications from families currently enrolled who access **more than 10% subsidy** or whose subsidy will change in January 2015.

*MassMutual will inform employees of the due date.* Forms will soon be available online at MM. **10% families are automatically re-enrolled. No new subsidy form is necessary.**

If families are eligible for subsidy *greater than 10%*, a copy of the 2014 1040 tax form must be submitted to the center with the application (in tuition drawer).

Families who enrolled over the summer or early fall who are eligible for greater than 10% subsidy **still need to submit a new 2014 Subsidy Application, but do not need to submit tax information** again.

All forms can be placed in the tuition drawer. If too bulky, feel free to place in an envelope on Pam's desk or slide under the door if closed.

## Teachers Love to Collect "Stuff"

If you have access to any of the following items, please feel free to ask your **child's teacher** if she would like you to donate them to the classroom:

*If parents call the center before 8:00 a.m. or after 4:30 p.m., our automated telephone system may pick up. If you need to speak to a staff person, press "8" and the phone will ring in the P3 room. An opening staff person will transfer you to an on-shift staff person as needed.
